W: Good morning, students! Last week, we learned about the various environmental impacts of natural disasters. Today, we're going to discuss how animals know natural disasters are coming before they happen. First, cats have sharp hearing abilities. With their keen auditory systems, they are known to sense and react to incoming disturbances, like hurricanes, before humans can perceive them. Second, elephants can detect low-frequency sounds and vibrations through their feet. This ability allows them to pick up on movement in the earth that humans might not notice until much later. Next, snakes can feel the slightest vibrations through the ground and leave their tunnels before an earthquake takes place. They have inner ears directly connected to the jawbone, which relays small movements to the ears. Finally, sharks can perceive changes in the Earth's electromagnetic field and know when to leave an area before natural disasters occur. They might sense vibrations in the water or detect some of the sounds that come before an eruption. Now, let's watch a video clip.
